Treasurer's Report:

The Toro has been repaired at an estimated cost of $\pounds 800$. We purchased the Toro in April 2019 for $\pounds 6000$. Since then we have expended $\pounds 7600$ in repairs to which has to be added the latest bill of $\pounds 800$. - repairs because of maladjustment of clearance between reel and bed knife 0.0007 inch

Discussion followed about feasiblity – should we be thinking of a less professional alternative?

Membership:

August list – there have been four new members this year, even though we had many more punters at the coaching sessions.

Recruitment and Coaching:

John Hancock to organise publicity for the club by preparing leaflets to go into welcome pack for new housing. Exact date of leaflet drop still under consideration.

A number of players have requested having coaching from Graham for GC. This is on-going. Two players still having AC instruction, they have joined the club and hope to take part in Short Croquet evenings.

A separate meeting to discuss the way forward with coaching (since we are still losing a number of coached players) will be arranged after the finals.

Property: Equipment

One trolley has had its wheels changed.

Geoff has agreed to liase with other members to strim the edges and mow the carpark with the Contax on Monday 4th September before the Spencer Ell Tournament.

Social bookings

The social bookings have been a mixed success due to the weather and numbers attending being reduced. However the last one proved very rewarding raising £240

Lawn Management:

Sandra has organised rota for meals and refreshments

Kathy has prepared rota for jobs am and pm.

Kathy will prepare a list of players so that their payments may be ticked off

David to prepare details of NDCC bank which can be handed out to those paying one lump sum for 5 days of lunch tea coffee etc.

Graham (overall mowing IC)to liase with Kathy re the mowing and the mowers.

John Wallace will instruct mowers the best way to mow round the hoops (Friday and Sunday)
